Child/Youth Worker**

**Tasks & Responsibilities:**

1. Assist in the provisions of Community Counselling & Resource Centre's (CCRC) non-profit Housing Social Worker (HSW) program in providing recreational summer programming to children/youth in selected social housing communities
2. Develop age appropriate, fun, educational recreational programming for children/youth living in social housing communities, in order to help foster healthy self-esteem.
3. Assist the HSW employee in organizing, attending and supervising outings for the children/youth on a weekly basis.
4. Assist the HSW in providing supervision and support to the children/youth involved in the program.
5. With the HSW, foster and build a positive, team-oriented culture among children, youth and supervisors.
6. Plan meals for the week and make weekly grocery list
7. Report weekly, on issues including impressions, challenges & suggestions.
8. Participate in additional programs and tasks related to the work of HSW and CCRC.

Desired level of education: Some post-Secondary (College or University)

A student enrolled in social services or child/youth program would be well suited to this position, but more importantly, they will have an understanding and interest in poverty issues, domestic violence issues, and a commitment to social justice as well as a willingness to work with diverse populations. Students will gain excellent experience to carry forward into a career in social services, education or child/youth work, based on a wide variety of tasks throughout the summer.

**Eligibility:**

This position is being advertised under the Canada Summer Jobs (CSJ) initiative. To be eligible for this position, you must be between 15 and 30 years of age on the start date of the job. You also must have been a full-time student during the previous academic year and be intending to return to full-time studies in the next academic year. You also must be a Canadian citizen, a permanent resident or a refugee under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act. You must also be legally entitled to work according to relevant provincial legislation and regulations.
