Many people in the Peterborough area are experiencing systemic pandemic-related stress, financial stress, anxiety, relationship issues, loss, and poverty. Professional counselling at CCRC continues to assist those faced with these stressors by developing and providing services catered to those seeking help.

Housing Resource Centre

On top of other challenges at this time of the year, loss of pandemic-related supports and low vacancies have left many unable to pay their rent, utilities, or simply find a place to live. HRC's programs are providing support through emergency financial assistance, building housingsearch portfolios, and landlord mediation to prevent eviction and homelessness.

- Thank you to the Ontario Trillium Foundation for a \$55,900 Resilient Communities Fund grant. With the grant, the CCRC will rebuild and recover from impacts of COVID-19 by hiring a full-time intake worker as well as purchasing a laptop, telephone, and program supplies to restore the capacity of the Housing Help Clinic in a COVID-safe manner.
- Through the United Way Homelessness Prevention Flex Fund, the CCRC has been provided \$56,855 to help with rent arrears preventing evictions, and to furnish and supply homes.
- This fall, thanks to a Pinnguaq grant funded by the Government of Canada under Digital Skills for Youth, we were able to hire an Administrative and Communications Assistant Intern to provide support with the CCRC's communications and fundraising initiatives.
