

## Only part of the picture

In 2018 \*44% of women self-reported experiencing domestic violence in Canada. in 2020 Statistics Canada reported: "every 6 days a woman in Canada is killed by her intimate partner".

This is the first time statistics on DV/IPV have been collated for the Peterborough area. While we are grateful to the organizations that are able to provide statistics, this is only a glimpse into the Domestic Violence situation in Peterborough City and County. There are many statistics that are or could not be included ie: how many children are impacted by DV, number of people missing work, or total number of individuals seeking private counselling for domestic violence, etc.

The Covid-19 pandemic created further difficulties for survivors to access services, and further isolated many people impacted by domestic violence. Agencies and organizations have faced strict restrictions and most were unable to operate at full capacity, which impacted how many individuals they were able to serve. The network is committed to collaboration and adaptation to better serve the needs of survivors in our communities.
