Our Professional Counselling program has also grown this past year. We expanded our counselling to Northumberland County, thanks to the Northumberland United Way, received specialized funding for men who have experienced sexual harm from the Ministry of Children Community and Social Services and most recently, thanks to the City of Peterborough, launched a one year pilot to support those on Ontario Works and the Ontario Disability Support Program. These funding opportunities have allowed us to connect with people who have been waiting, in some cases over a year, for counselling. When they were finally called with an appointment, many cried with gratitude as they so desperately needed support.

We are thrilled to have the opportunity to increase our services to more people than ever in all our program areas. Despite that, the need continues to exceed our capacity, just like in many other worthy organizations in our community. 
